What Is Permanent Supportive Housing?







Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) is an intervention that combines affordable housing assistance with voluntary support services to address the needs of homeless people with permanent

A person who is "chronically homeless" is an unaccompanied homeless individual with a disabling condition, or a family with at least one adult member who has a disabling condition, who has either been continuously homeless for a year or more OR has had at least four (4) episodes of homelessness in the past three (3) years.

disabilities. The services are designed to provide support to help people maintain stable housing and connect people with community-based health care, treatment, and/or employment services. PSH projects often serve people defined as chronically homeless by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

PSH in Ottawa County


Serving 128 individuals and families January - June 2022

Community Mental Health reported providing housing for 38 people in families and 58 individuals. This program works with people who are literally homeless and permanently disabled, and prioritizes serving people who are chronically homeless.

B Good Samaritan
Ministries—who
administers a small-scale,
7-bed PSH project that
specifically serves people
who experience chronic
homelessness—provided
housing and supportive
services for six adults and
one child.

HHI Management manages project-based vouchers—vouchers tied to particular apartment complexes—served 15

people in households with children and 10 individuals.



An adult household member must have a long-term, diagnosed disability to be eligible for permanent supportive housing programs.


