

November is Homeless Awareness Month


The mission of the Lakeshore Housing Alliance is to work collaboratively to meet the needs of people at risk of or experiencing homelessness in Ottawa County. Together the LHA member agencies work to:

Develop and promote integrated, community-wide strategies and plans to prevent and end homelessness.

Close the front door to homelessness by offering prevention services, linking people in housing crisis to permanent housing programs, and promoting access to mainstream resources.

Provide a variety of options for permanent housing and offer wraparound and intensive case management services that open the back door out of homelessness.

Number of Homeless Persons





So far, in 2022, the Street

People are homeless longer due to the lack of available and affordable housing. The average length of time homeless increased by 22 days in 2020/2021.

Point in Time

The Point in Time count takes place annually on the last Wednesday of January. This year's PIT count was held on January 26, 2022, and counted 200 people who were literally homeless: staying in emergency shelter, transitional housing or in a place not meant for human habitation, a significant increase from 2021.
